# M6 Incontinence and a Frustrated Trip to the Bathroom

Fluid leaks are inevitable with any car if they stay in service long enough. Sooner or later at least one seal, hose, gasket, or fitting *somewhere* will stop containing the liquid it was intended to control. Admittedly these failures are annoying but we usually deal with them in a relatively benign way when they crop up because they are typical, dare I say expected. Ordinarily so do I, BUT... some things are just not supposed to happen the way they do no matter what. It's just an unwritten law of life. If and when they do happen it's just plain wrong.

Since the day I took delivery from the dealer 15 years ago, the M6 has blessed me with remarkably few problems. Those it has developed have been fairly minor and quickly fixed (yes, I'm knocking on some serious wood here, rubbing rosary beads, praying a LOT, and so on). As a result, when something malfunctions with it, I can usually identify the source easily, fix it with minimal drama, and be done with it.

Thanks to some diligent car care (some call it obsessive but what do they know) visible leaks of any kind have never been allowed to progress beyond a weep before they have been snuffed. This has kept the undercarriage of the car remarkably clean and dry over time. It has done the same for the garage floor in the bay I use. So when the car began leaving small drops of fluid on the ground last season it was grounds for a state of emergency and a trip to the pharmacy for tranquilizers.

In most cases like this the fix is a simple matter and I expected nothing different. You lift the car, roll underneath, locate the leak and figure out what needs to be done to stop it. Simple, huh? Just like any other vehicle with leaks, right? Not this time.

First glance showed a soaking wet power steering pump. No big deal I thought. I shouldn't be too angry since every single hose in the car was original; none of the steering plumbing seals had ever been changed, and none of the hose clamps had ever been tightened. Further inspection showed the hoses to be serviceable but loose due to original crimp-style clamps having bedded into the hose material with time, consequently losing their "squeeze". Original clamps were all removed, replaced with adjustable ones, leak residue was carefully wiped up, cleaned with solvent, and all should be well. No more messy annoying leakage.

Time passed and the garage floor told a different story. Several more trips under the car took place while evidence of continuing leakage remained. Evidence of hair having been yanked out of my head in frustration joined it but I was not going to let it beat me. The fluid was fairly thick and smelled much like oil so I ruled out fuel, coolant and brake fluid. The leak was too slow to allow gathering enough of it to honestly tell color and, thanks to fan air and road wind blasting through, any existing wetness was scattered *everywhere* behind the immediate pump area. Continual checks of all fluid levels still didn't show any being noticeably low so I had no clues. Nothing made sense. Cars don't just manufacture leaks from out of nowhere... there had to be a source.

It was time to think outside the box. I needed to drop the idea that just because the power steering pump was always freshly wet, it implied that the leak was from that system. There was nothing else in that area of the engine bay that had anything to do with retaining oily liquids other than the oil pressure sending unit. I checked that and found it dry. I was slowly beginning to consider that I would have to admit defeat, turn the car over to a shop and pay for absurd hours of doing what I had already done...something I avoid like the plague.

It was on a frustrated, grouchy trip to the bathroom (I do some excellent thinking in the bathroom) that I finally had a new idea. To find the leak, the car should be running so everything was up to temperature, pressure, and flowing BUT.... it didn't necessarily have to be driving to do it, thereby removing the wind factor from the equation. I would

raise the car, clean *everything* (again), start it up, roll back underneath, and do some serious inspection while it was running. What I saw simultaneously made my day and blew my mind, all at once.

The leak wasn't coming from any hose; rather it was coming out of the *wiring harness* and dripping ever so slowly onto the power steering pump from above. I lay there thinking, "Since when do wires leak fluid?". Then it dawned on me. I knew of odd cases where oil pressure sending units developed *internal* leaks through their electrical contact passages, not externally where they could easily be seen. Since BMW is so good at making things fit tightly and seal well, and the dripping wire harness went in that exact direction, I figured I was on to something. The new challenge became gaining access to test my theory. Seeing the sending unit is simple. Being able to put a wrench on it takes an act of Congress.

To properly access the sending unit on an M6 requires removing the entire multi-piece air box assembly (remember, an M6 has six individual throttle bodies, not just one), adding to the annoyance of the whole issue. Once the air box system was out, I was staring at a perfectly dry sending unit... until I pulled off the tightly sealed conduit for the wires from the sender, only to find it FULL of engine oil that had been running down inside the wiring harness conduit, dripping onto the steering pump, splattering everywhere in the breeze in the process, and driving me insane for so long.

Finally reaching a solution was somewhat bittersweet. I was highly confident that I had found the problem at last, but I cursed the twisted engineer who had placed such a common failure item in such an obscure location. Sometimes I think engineers sit at their drawing boards, work up a design, snicker and say, "HA, let them try to figure out how to get THIS replaced!". What the engineers don't take into account is that the person they are trying to outwit might have to visit the bathroom, where they will have a brainstorm and be able to overcome almost any challenge.
