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
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

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

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#### What a Winter! Can it Please be Over?

As I type these words, the winter temps are barely starting to climb into the 40s yet. Have you realized how much wear and tear is going on your ride's chassis from all this salt and road grime? This year especially, with all the salt pile-up from weeks of driving in intense blizzard action, it may take a little extra time to care for your undercarriage. On the membership news front, the White Mountain Chapter lost seven members since the last edition of *the Profile* but we did gain five. We currently have 575 primary members, 100 associate members and 10 life members bringing the grand total to 685 members. Out of those, 647 of our members reside in New Hampshire. Locally speaking, our population is concentrated heavily in two counties; Hillsborough County has 35% and Rockingham, 32%. Nashua is the city with the highest concentration of members at 53, with Bedford coming in second at 34. Rounding out the top 10 are Windham, Manchester, Amherst, Hollis, Merrimack, Salem, Concord, Stratham, and Dover.

#### Club Motorsports - Part 2 Grit & Passion Building a World-Class Facility by: Pete McDonough photos: Pete McDonough & Club Motorsports

In the last Profile edition, Pete started shedding some light on the rumors that a motorsports country club was being built in New Hampshire. In this edition he continues his exposé. -ed.

 ${f S}$  o with the physical tour nearly complete, in my head I'm still fixated on this notion of organizational persistence – the idea that CMI has been working on this project for 13 years. Jim has been in this thing from the beginning and has skillfully and tactfully addressed community opposition, environmental concerns, legal and financial challenges. It hasn't been an easy road – by any stretch – but he has persisted. Jim also put me in touch with Dave Mirabasi and Lloyd Dahmen to further understand the organization's history and the nature of its persistence.

As the story goes, the idea for Club Motorsports was conceived by two friends who have a passion for performance driving. As driving instructors, amateur racers and co-owners of an M3 Lightweight, Dave Mirabassi and Dan Croteau have driven at courses all over the Northeast and Canada. On a return trip from Canada's Le Circuit Mont Tremblant (another course designed by Wilson), they had an epiphany that the area where the Lakes Region meets the White Mountains would make an ideal home for a new road course.

"The idea started like so many crazy ideas that you come up with. Dan (Croteau) and I were looking for a piece of dirt that we could rally race bikes and cars on and stumbled onto the land that is now Valley Motorsports Park" advised Dave, who is both a co-founder and current member of CMI's board of directors. But as they moved beyond the concept and began the design work, they faced a labyrinth of challenges and things ground to a halt. "We realized that we were onto a good thing but were in over our head so we brought in a business Not just the joy of motorsport - of being pushed forward by internal combustion wrapped in beautifully formed sheet metal but also the intangibles emanating from it.

developer to help us through all the red tape, which took longer than we expected" Dave reflected. "We never looked at this as a commercial development - it's way too exciting to be called something like that. It's a motorsports park where we can drive fast, hang with friends that think, act and enjoy the same things that we do. You get to teach your kids to do it and bring first time friends... it's a win-win." In addition to the M3 that he and Dan raced, it's interesting to note that Dave's garage also includes a '73 2002, '94 528i and an '03 528i.

Lloyd Dahmen, who currently handles investor relations for CMI, served as the company's president before Jim and is one of the original investors. He explains that there are now 28 investors whose private equity has almost entirely funded the project which is in the \$25-30M range. Like many others who have become involved, part of Lloyd's motivation was his passion for driving. "Part of the attraction was having a place to drive in a spirited manner without breaking the law and in a safe environment -safe not only due to the design of the course but safe from the distractions of today's multitasking drivers."

Though not an avid racer, Lloyd does like to get on the track and push the limits. He noted that among other events, he and a team of friends participate in NHMS's 24 Hours of Lemons and run a Nissan 300ZX. Some of the cars in Lloyd 's stable include Lancia, Ferrari, Mercedes (1956 300SL) and BMW (1956 BMW 507). In somewhat a state of disrepair when he purchased it, Lloyd personally rebuilt the engine in the 507. After much care and attention, the 507 was entered in the 2014 Boston Cup, the region's premier classic car show held each September on Boston Common. Given his passion for the restoration, it's not surprising that he took home second place honors in the German Class.

I think back to my earlier question of persistence in the face of adversity. As I consider all that I've learned about Club Motorsports, I think the answer to this question boils down to a simple concept known as grit. In her TED appearance (*www.TED.com/talks*), Angela Lee Duckworth talks about "grit" as determinant for success. She describes grit as "...a passion and perseverance

for very long-term goals, having stamina and sticking with your future, day in and day out... not just for the week, not just for the month but for the years and working really hard to make that future a reality. Grit is living life like it's a marathon not a sprint." In the case of Club Motorsport, I think their grit is fueled by a passion for all things automotive. Not just the joy of motorsport – of being pushed forward by internal combustion that is wrapped in beautifully formed sheet metal – but also the intangibles that emanate from it – like the shared interests that drive friendship and camaraderie. The more I get to know the folks at Club Motorsports, the more I know that these guys have grit coursing through their veins and that they are going to be a huge success.

#### New Hands Free Electronic Device Law In Effect July 1, 2015

uly 1st of this year, a new law takes effect in New Hampshire. Here's what the "Hands Free" law will mean to drivers across the state:

- No use of hand held electronic devices capable of providing voice or data communication while driving or temporarily halted in traffic for a stop sign or traffic signal or other momentary delays.
- This includes cell phones, GPS, tablets, iPods, iPads or other devices that require data entry.
- Emergency calls to 911 or other public safety agencies will be allowed.
- Bluetooth or other hands-free electronic devices will be allowed.
- One hand non-cellular 2-way radio use will be allowed.
- Teen drivers under the age of 18 will not be allowed to use any electronic devices (hand held or not) except to report an emergency. Anyone violating this will be subject to penalties and license suspension or revocation.

#### **Penalties for Violations**



 1st Offense ------ \$100 fine\*

 2nd Offense ------ \$250 fine\*

3rd Off. within 2 years --- \$500 fine\*

\*/ Penalty assessments will be added to the fines

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#### State of New Hampshire House Bill 1360<sup>2</sup>

#### 265:79-c Impeded Driving.

I. No person, when operating a motor vehicle, shall permit to be on or in the vehicle or on or about his or her person anything which is interfering with or impeding the proper operation of the vehicle or any equipment by which the vehicle is operated or controlled.

II. Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a violation and shall be fined \$100 plus penalty assessment for a first offense, \$250 plus penalty assessment for a second offense, and \$500 plus penalty assessment for any subsequent offense within a 24 month period.

265:79-d Use of Mobile Electronic Devices While Driving; Prohibition.

I.(a) No person while driving a moving motor vehicle upon a way or temporarily halted in traffic for a traffic control device or other momentary delay, shall use any hand-held mobile electronic device, including but not limited to reading, composing or writing an email message or text message, initiating, receiving, or conducting a conversation, initiating a command or request to access the Internet, or inputting information into a global positioning system or navigation device.

(b) "Driving," for the purposes of this section, shall not include when a person is behind the controls of a vehicle that has pulled to the side of or off the road at a location where it is legal to do so and where the vehicle remains stationary with the gear selector in park or neutral or the parking brake engaged, and no portion of the vehicle remains in the travel portion of the public way.

(c) "Mobile electronic device" shall mean any hand-held or other portable electronic equipment capable of providing data communication between 2 or more persons, including, without limitation, a mobile telephone, a text messaging device, a paging device, a personal digital assistant, a laptop computer, electronic equipment that is capable of playing a video game or digital video disk, equipment on which digital photographs are taken or transmitted, or any combination thereof, or equipment that is capable of visually receiving a television broadcast.

II. It shall not be an offense under this section for any person driving a motor vehicle upon a way:

(a) To make use of a cellular telephone or mobile radio telephone to report an emergency to the enhanced 911 system or directly to a law enforcement agency, fire department, or emergency medical provider.

(b) While driving a police car, fire truck, ambulance, or other public safety vehicle, taxicab, passenger bus, commercial truck, vehicle engaged in deliveries, or vehicle engaged in the maintenance of public ways, to transmit and receive brief voice messages over a mobile 2-way radio on a public safety or business frequency while in the course of business or in the line of duty.

(c) To use a Bluetooth enabled or other hands-free electronic device to send or receive information provided the driver does not have to divert his or her attention from the road ahead.

III. Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a violation and shall be fined \$100 plus penalty assessment for a first offense, \$250 plus penalty assessment for a second offense, and \$500 plus penalty assessment for any subsequent offense within a 24 month period.

IV. No person less than 18 years of age shall use a cellular or mobile telephone or other mobile electronic device, whether hands-free or not, while driving a motor vehicle in motion or temporarily stopped in traffic upon any way, except to report an emergency to the enhanced 911 system or any public safety agency. A person violating this paragraph shall be subject to the fines in paragraph III and license suspension or revocation under 263:14, III.

#### Why the Law is Important

- During the past 4 years, 116 fatal crashes in New Hampshire were caused by distraction.
- The increasing use of electronic devices is fast becoming the primary distraction.
- While texting, a driver is 23 times more likely to crash.
- Sending or receiving a text distracts the driver for almost 5 seconds.
- At 50 miles per hour, we travel longer than the length of a football field during that 5 seconds.
- Even dialing a phone number increases the risk of crashing by 3 times.

Eligibility:

This contest is completely free and open to any White Mountain Chapter member or associate member in good-standing as of the date of their entry submission. Only the person who actually took the photo (at *any* point in time) may enter it.

Photos entered must portray a connection to BMW or the BMW CCA. The photographer must also have had legal right to take and distribute the photos. Image post-processing is permissible, but must have been done by the individual making the submission. Entries must be received no later than December 31st, 2015.

#### Winning the Contest:

Judging will be done by *the Profile's* editorial staff, who's decisions are final. Submissions will be judged on both subject and quality. Winners will be determined by mid-January and will be recognized either at the 2016 Winter Reunion or at the monthly membership meeting, as well as on the chapter website and in the February/March *Profile* edition.

#### Submissions:

Photos may be in color or black & white. Only high-resolution digital images (TIF, JPG, DNG or RAW files) can be accepted. The Preferred method of submission is by e.mail to *the Profile's* Copy Collection Editor, Pete McDonough (*editor@whitemtn-bmwclub.org*). Each image must be sent as an individually attached file, not simply as an image imbedded in the body of the e.mail message. (If your image is too large for sending as an e.mail attachment, you may postal mail a CD containing all your images, or use a mutually acceptable internet file transfer service.
